



Sustainable Campus Group Report Launch

You are invited to the Sustainable Campus Group's **2011 Australian Tertiary Education Sector Sustainability Report** Launch. As well as covering highlights of this year's report and an update on research about sustainability in the higher education sector, we will be hearing from two guest speakers:

- **Hadi Michael Salem** will discuss his energy saving technology developed as part of his Engineering degree, his commitment to including sustainability in the curriculum, and some of the barriers to EfS that he encountered.
- **Kevin Lloyd** is the Team Leader Purchasing & Business Transactions, Supply Team at Melbourne Water and he will be discussing Melbourne Water's journey to award winning green procurement.

Hadi is in his penultimate year of a Bachelor of Mechatronics Engineering and Bachelor of Commerce double degree at Monash University. He is a graduate of the Monash University: Vice Chancellor's 'Ancora Imparo' Leadership Program and an ongoing participant in the Faculty of Engineering's Leadership in a Technological Environment (LITE) Program. Hadi was Vice-President of the Monash Chapter for Engineers without Borders in 2010 and continues to volunteer with Engineers Australia in their High School Outreach program. In 2010, Hadi was part of a research team that worked alongside colleagues at the Office of Environmental Sustainability at Monash to design an RFID controlled module that can help reduce power consumption in offices.

Melbourne Water won in three categories in the 2011 ECO-Buy Awards for Excellence in Green Purchasing including Overall Champion; Policy, Strategy and Communications; and Procurement Process. Melbourne Water treats and supplies drinking water and looks after Melbourne's water supply catchments, rivers, creeks and major drainage systems.
