# THIS CHART IS DESIGNED TO HELP YOU JUDGE THE SERIOUSNESS OF BEHAVIOURS THAT YOU MAY BE WORRIED ABOUT IN SOMEONE ELSE-AND TO DECIDE WHAT YOU SHOULD DO IN RESPONSE.

NOTE: By itself – CRYING/DISTRESS is NOT pathology and should not be treated as such. TEARS are frequently a normal response to a difficult situation – and may be an expression of pain/fear/sadness. It is a normal reaction for you to want to provide comfort and stop the person crying. This is not always the best thing to do, but may help you to feel you are doing something. However, if combined with some of the behaviours listed above – action may be necessary.

The "action rating" indicates how important it is for you to do something - and the \* legend beneath the chart provides a guide to help you decide whether or not to

\*\* speak to the person concerned,

\*\*\* consult a third party, or

\*\*\*\* call for an emergency response.

The  $\checkmark\checkmark\checkmark$  rating for the behaviour about which you are concerned, provides a rough indication of how likely it is to be

- > a NORMAL reaction to a painful situation, or
- > a sign that someone is thinking about suicide, or
- a sign of mental illness.

I have not named specific illnesses as you are not being asked to make a DIAGNOSIS, but to know when, and how to help.
