RESEARCH

Monash is recognised globally for its research excellence. In this course, you have the opportunity to undertake a research project in your final year and be matched with an expert supervisor in mental health.

The Master of Mental Health can be completed either by coursework or by research. Completing the research stream can be used as a pathway to a graduate research degree (such as Doctor of Philosophy).
