MASTERCLASS

This masterclass will focus on the key aspects of ethical practice and technological issues involved in providing supervision to provisionally registered and registered psychologists in a range of contexts. Topics to be covered include: Boundaries & self disclosure in the supervision relationship, competence and self care issues in supervisees, and record keeping for supervisors. Issues related to technology use in supervision will also be considered including social media, supervision via video conference, privacy/ confidentiality in technologically mediated environments, and consideration of emergent technologies such as artificial intelligence. The masterclass will involve interactive activities and case-based discussion. This Masterclass will reference the existing APS Code of Ethics, and with an eye to the future, refer to the draft AHPRA Code of Conduct as applicable.
