

# MASTER OF HEALTH MANAGEMENT

## UNCOVER YOUR LEADERSHIP POTENTIAL IN HEALTH

Prepare to advance into management, or consolidate your acquired knowledge with leadership theory in this course that produces confident decision-makers, capable of steering healthcare services through complex and challenging environments.

Healthcare stewardship carries broad responsibilities such as driving good clinical outcomes and patient experiences, ensuring programs are cost-effective and efficient, integrating new systems and technologies, and managing a diverse, professional workforce.

Targeted to the specific needs of this sector, this course is taught by some of Australia's most senior and respected health care managers, leading management and health policy academics, and industry specialists.

Gain advanced skills and knowledge across health systems law, finance, clinical leadership and management, governance, policy reform, interpretation of data, and systems to lead change and innovation in the health care setting.

### In the Master of Health Management you will:

- Learn how to apply principles of management specific to health care organisations.
- Explore complex workplace management problems and problem-solving techniques.
- Develop epidemiological and statistic capabilities for evidence-based medicine, quality improvement and program evaluations.
- Advance your interpersonal, communication and leadership skills.

## COURSE STRUCTURE

The course is delivered largely online, with convenient in-person block days at the Alfred Precinct in Melbourne, to enhance learning and facilitate networking opportunities.

## PROFESSIONAL RECOGNITION

The Master of Health Management is approved by the Royal Australasian College of Medical Administrators (RACMA) for Candidates undertaking the RACMA Fellowship Training Program, and the Australasian College of Health Services Management (ACHSM) for college entry and advancement purposes.

## CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Leadership roles in public health, hospitals, primary and community care, aged care services, not-for-profit, government & non-government sectors, international health, divisions of general practice, local government, health insurance companies, health planning, and research.

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Entry point 1 (96 credits, 2yrs full time/4 yrs part time): An Australian bachelor degree (or equivalent) in a cognate discipline with at least a credit (60%) average, AND one year of relevant work experience approved by the faculty.

Entry point 2 (72 credits, 1.5yrs full time/3 yrs part time): An Australian bachelor degree (or equivalent) in a cognate discipline with at least a credit (60%) average, AND two years of relevant work experience approved by the faculty.

Entry point 3 (48 credits, 1yr full time/2 yrs part time): A Monash University Graduate Diploma of Health Management (M5007) with a minimum weighted average mark of at least 60%.

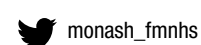
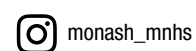
