# CONFIDENCE IN COURT STARTS WITH MOOTING

## THE BASICS OF MOOTING

Mooting simulates a court hearing, where student teams analyse a legal problem, research the relevant law, craft written submissions and present an oral argument to a judge or panel of judges.

The judge or judges will ask questions, and mooters are expected to answer logically, coherently and persuasively. Mooters also learn to 'read the room', and understand courtroom dynamics.

Mooting can be both exhilarating and scary at first. It lets you demonstrate your strength in advocacy and is an intellectual challenge that calls for quick thinking. But don't worry — you'll be supported every step of the way by your law mooting coach. As with everything else, practice makes perfect.

## WHY MOOTING IS IMPORTANT

The teamwork, legal research, critical thinking, writing and public speaking skills involved in mooting will prepare you for the real-life requirements of a litigation career, and more immediately, for academic success!

Mooting also builds confidence, enhances your ability to think on your feet, and teaches you to present complex ideas clearly and persuasively. These are all highly desirable and transferable skills that will set you up for success across legal and non-legal careers.



# HOW DO I GET INTO MONASH LAW?

Ways to boost your selection rank, pathways, scholarships and more.

## WHY YOU MIGHT BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE SPECIAL ENTRY ACCESS SCHEME (SEAS)

Before you think that SEAS isn't for you, consider the wide-ranging list of barriers to academic potential that it considers. The four categories are:

1. Personal information and location, which includes:
  - your living or school location
  - your gender, if it is under-represented in a course or field of study
  - your age, if you're 21 or older on 1 January of the year you are applying
  - recognition as an Indigenous Australian
  - recognition for being from a non-English speaking background, and
  - recognition for being the first in your family to attend tertiary study.
2. Disadvantaged financial background.
3. Disability or medical condition.
4. Difficult circumstances, which includes having experienced
  - domestic, family or sexual violence
  - homelessness or formal out-of-home care
  - natural disasters
  - other difficult family and life circumstances, as well as
  - holding refugee or asylum seeker status.

### WHAT IS SEAS?

The Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS) is a type of special consideration that aims to level the playing field for university applicants by considering the barriers you might have faced in life and school.

SEAS does this by increasing your selection rank for the courses you're applying for, therefore bettering your chances of receiving an offer to study at Monash Law.

The maximum available adjustment at Monash is 20 aggregate points (up to 10 ATAR points).

# LAWYER, SOLICITOR, BARRISTER – AN EXPLAINER

## WHAT IS A LAWYER?

Anyone who completes steps 1 to 5 below can be called a lawyer.

### WHAT IS A SOLICITOR?

Solicitors are qualified lawyers who are not barristers or judges. Solicitors give legal advice, handle contracts, wills and documents. Solicitors don't usually appear before courts or tribunals. Most lawyers and solicitors work in law firms or as legal advisors in organisations.

*Roles include: General Counsel, Principal Legal Officer, Human Rights Lawyer*

### WHAT IS A BARRISTER?

A barrister is a lawyer who has also passed the Bar Entrance Exam. **Complete steps 1 to 7 below to become one.** Barristers have specialist skills in dispute resolution, litigation strategy and advice, and advocacy before the court. A big part of their work is appearing and arguing cases in court. All barristers are self-employed. Do you enjoy debating, acting or moot court competitions? You could be suited to become a barrister.

*Roles include: Junior Counsel, Senior Counsel, King's Counsel*



### LAW CAREERS THAT DON'T NEED YOU TO BE A PRACTISING LAWYER

Work as a legal policy advisor, law academic, risk management consultant, in-house legal consultant, corporate governance officer, arbitrator, mediator, migration agent and many more.



# STEPS TO BECOME A LAWYER

## 1 STUDY A MONASH BACHELOR OF LAWS (HONS)

Choose any of our single or double degrees.

Your Monash Law degree is recognised by the Victorian Legal Admissions Board (VLAB) as well as overseas accreditation bodies, and satisfies the educational requirements for admission to practice law in the state of Victoria.

If you don't progress to the next step, you can still pursue careers that don't require you to be a practising lawyer.

## 2 COMPLETE LEGAL TRAINING

6–12 months

Either an approved Practical Legal Training (PLT) course or at least 12 months of Supervised Legal Practice.

This is a must for graduates who want to be admitted to the legal profession. Many Monash Law graduates complete this via supervised legal training in their employer's graduate program. Alternatively, you can complete a practical legal training course through an accredited provider.

## 3 APPLY FOR ADMISSION TO PRACTISE: FIT AND PROPER PERSON

Apply for admission within 5 years of graduating from your law degree.

The Victorian Legal Admissions Board (VLAB) assesses if you can be admitted as a lawyer. This includes satisfying the board that you are a "Fit and Proper Person" of good moral character. Once you receive your Certificate of Admission, you are recognised as a lawyer.

Once you are admitted in any State or Territory in Australia, it is not necessary to be admitted again in another State or Territory.

## 4 ADMISSION CEREMONY

Once VLAB approves your application, you may choose to attend the admission ceremony in person. This is where you take an oath of office, sign the Supreme Court Roll, and receive your Certificate of Admission. After these steps, you are recognised as a lawyer.

## 5 APPLY FOR A PRACTISING CERTIFICATE

You're officially a lawyer who can practice as a solicitor!

### 6 PASS THE BAR READERS' COURSE ENTRANCE EXAM (AKA 'BAR ENTRANCE EXAM')

### 7 COMPLETE THE 9-MONTH READING PERIOD
