

MAKE AN IMPACT TO INDIVIDUALS AND COMMUNITIES

Develop specialist knowledge and professional skills to support individuals and communities impacted by addiction.

The Graduate Certificate and Graduate Diploma of Addictive Behaviours are delivered in partnership with Turning Point, an internationally recognised addiction treatment, research and education centre.

You will learn from local and international experts about contemporary addiction issues to support the health and social wellbeing of people and communities affected by substance use (alcohol, prescription medication or illicit drugs), process addictions (gambling or gaming) and other emerging addictive behaviours.

In the Graduate Certificate and Graduate Diploma of Addictive Behaviours you will:

- Learn about theory and concepts about how addiction problems can develop and persist.
- Explore how addiction impacts individuals, families, communities and social systems.
- Develop specialist skills to identify and manage addiction issues and support appropriate treatment interventions.
- Evaluate evidence-based interventions for substance use and behavioural (process) addictions.

Foundation studies in addictive behaviours

Develop theoretical foundations for applying holistic biopsychosocial approaches to evidence-based practice innovations for the diagnosis and management of substance use disorders and process addictions.

GRADUATE DIPLOMA

Core studies in addictive behaviours

Gain a deeper understanding of core addiction concepts such as social and cultural perspectives, historical and contemporary addiction policy, and public health interventions for managing addiction and preventing harm.
