

Professor Frederick 'Skip' Burkle Jnr, Annual Keynote Lecture



Professor Burkle is a retired senior fellow and scientist, the Harvard Humanitarian Initiative, Harvard School of Public Health, and former senior scholar and senior associate faculty and research scientist, the Centre for Refugee & Disaster Response, Johns Hopkins University Medical Institutes. He also served as a senior international public policy scholar, Woodrow Wilson Centre for International Scholars, Washington, DC (2008-2016). In addition, he served as adjunct professor, and as a clinical professor of surgery and adjunct professor in tropical medicine, at the University of Hawaii. He is also adjunct professor, Department of Military & Emergency Medicine, Uniformed Services University of Health Sciences, Bethesda, MD, and the Department of Public Health and Tropical Medicine, James Cook University, Australia. He is a former Adjunct Professor at Monash University Department of Community Emergency Health and Paramedic Practice and is currently an advisor and mentor at the Monash University Disaster Resilience Initiative. Professor Burkle received the 2011 Peter Safar Award given to a person considered to have made substantial contributions to the field of disaster and emergency health as determined by the Executive Committee of the World Association for Disaster and Emergency Medicine (WADEM). Professor Burkle has published more than 240 scientific articles and authored four books about international disaster management.

Mr. Jonathan Abrahams is based in the Disaster Risk Reduction and Resilience Unit in the Health Security Preparedness Department of the WHO Health Emergencies Programme, Geneva, Switzerland. Since 2008 he has been playing key roles in advancing WHO's global leadership in health emergency and disaster risk management (EDRM).

As a WHO focal point with the UN system, Mr Abrahams provided advocacy and advice on public health to Member States for the negotiation of Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction that puts health at the centre of global, national and community actions on all- hazards disaster risk management. He has played an instrumental role in developing policy and technical guidance such as the WHO Heath EDRM Framework that bridges humanitarian action, climate change adaptation, epidemic preparedness and response, health system strengthening and disaster risk reduction. With the aim of building county capacities, Mr Abrahams supports WHO Regional and Country Offices and partners, and continues to facilitate global partnerships, including the WHO's Thematic Platform on Health EDRM and its associated Research Network, to enable local and national action.

Before joining WHO, Mr. Abrahams was Director, Public Health in Emergencies, Asian Disaster Preparedness Centre, Thailand, from 2005-2008 where he worked with WHO partners to strengthen country systems and capacities in the Asia-Pacific region. He has worked with Emergency Management Australia, AusAlD's Humanitarian and Emergency Response Unit and the Department of Veterans' Affairs. He is an author and editor of many articles, technical guides and learning packages in public health, EDRM and business continuity planning. Mr. Abrahams also holds qualifications in public health and emergency management and received the WADEM President's Award in 2017 as recognition of his contribution to the World Association for Disaster and Emergency Medicine's collaboration with WHO and to the field of disaster health.
