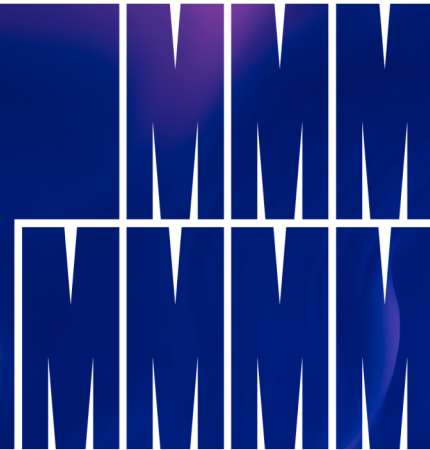


BACHELOR OF NURSING AND BACHELOR OF MIDWIFERY (HONOURS)

CLINICAL PLACEMENTS

Throughout your degree, you’ll complete a minimum **840 nursing and 840 midwifery clinical placement hours**, immersing yourself in real-life practice across maternity services, acute medical and surgical wards, mental health, community care, and more, in both metropolitan and rural settings. It’s your chance to truly experience life as a nurse and as a midwife.

You will also undertake the midwifery care of 10 women throughout their pregnancy, labour, birth and the time after birth.
