

WANT TO STUDY IN MELBOURNE? HOW TO APPLY TO MONASH FOR SOUTH AUSTRALIAN APPLICANTS

Applying to study at Monash is different to applying to university through SATAC. This guide will give you tips on how to apply through VTAC for Monash courses and scholarships, it also features information on accommodation and SACE score conversions.

WHAT IS VTAC (VICTORIAN TERTIARY ADMISSIONS CENTRE)?

VTAC is the Victorian version of SATAC, who are responsible for processing applications and offers for places in Victorian universities. The two centres operate independently. The offer you receive from VTAC does not impact your offer from SATAC and you can receive an offer from both.

Important tip

When registering at vtac.edu.au, use an email account that you will have access to well into next year.

VTAC key dates

- VTAC opens: Early August 2023
- Timely applications close: Late September 2023
- SEAS and scholarship application close: Early October 2023

Check vtac.edu.au/dates for the timely application opening and closing dates for,

- ATAR release
- Change of Preference
- Offer rounds.

Note: It is recommended that you apply for courses during the timely application period. Some courses such as Medicine cannot be added to your preferences after the timely application period has closed.

Apply for SEAS (Special Entry Access Scheme)

SEAS adjusts your ATAR in recognition of circumstances that may have affected your education. This gives you a better chance of getting an offer for the course you want.

You may be eligible for SEAS if you satisfy the requirements for one or more of the following SEAS categories:

Category 1: Personal Information

- Indigenous Australian
- Born in a non-English-speaking country and moved to Australia after 1 January 2018
- Live in a low socio-economic area
- Attend a school in a regional or remote location
- Aged 21 or older on 1 January 2024

Category 2: Financial disadvantage

Category 3: Disability or medical condition

Category 4: Difficult circumstances

- Experienced difficult personal circumstances
- Being a refugee or asylum seeker

Applications for SEAS are made through VTAC after you have submitted your course preferences. Learn more about SEAS and check eligibility criteria at: monash.edu/entry-schemes

The Monash Guarantee

The Monash Guarantee can get you into a Monash course even if you haven't reached the course's lowest selection rank. You could be eligible for the Monash Guarantee if you:

- have experienced financial disadvantage
- live in a low socio-economic area
- are an Indigenous Australian
- attend a Monash listed under-represented school

To apply for the Monash Guarantee, you must:

- submit a VTAC course application and include your preferred Monash University courses in your preference list
- complete a Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS) application including any required documentation

PREREQUISITES

To be accepted into Monash University all course entry requirements must be met. Entry requirements include prerequisite subjects or extra selection requirements such as interviews and folios.

All Monash courses require English to be considered for entry. Most courses require a C+ mark but some require a higher mark. Check your course at monash.edu/study for prerequisites and study scores. Some Monash courses will accept English-rich units if you did not undertake an English unit as part of SACE.

Entry requirements are listed in terms of VCE subject and required VCE scores. To see the SACE equivalent scores see the table below.

ACCOMMODATION

Monash Residential Services (MRS) looks after all aspects of student accommodation at Monash University.

Applications for on-campus accommodation in 2024 will open on 1 September 2023. There is no cost to apply and accommodation is offered on a 'first-in, first-served' basis so we recommend applying early. There is also no cancellation fee if you decide you no longer wish to proceed with your application. You can also submit your accommodation application prior to receiving your Monash course offer.

MRS also offers an off-campus advisory service to guide and support those students who wish to live off-campus.

MONASH SCHOLARSHIPS

Monash will match you to the best, most appropriate scholarship for your situation when you apply through VTAC.

Students applying for Monash Scholarships via VTAC will no longer require a separate application. Applicants who have a Monash course on their VTAC preferences will automatically be assessed for scholarships based on,

- ATAR for merit-based scholarships, &
- SEAS data for scholarships that have an equity category requirement.

Check VTAC for application and SEAS closing dates.
