Bariatric Surgery Registry – 2025 Highlights



- Introduction of SMS Annual Follow-Up: Implemented SMS-based annual follow-up to streamline data collection and significantly improve patient engagement.
- PROMs Completion: Strengthened the quality and completeness of patient-reported outcome measures, providing deeper insights into patient experiences and outcomes.
- Surgeon Feedback Survey: Gathered valuable surgeon feedback to inform future system enhancements and service improvements.
- Transition of New Zealand Operations: Successfully relocated New Zealand registry operations to the BSR Melbourne office, improving operational efficiency and coordination.

Publications in 2025:

- Metabolic bariatric surgery generates substantial, sustained weight loss and health improvement in a real-world setting.
- Robotic bariatric surgery in Australia: early outcomes from a national clinical quality registry with propensity score-matched analysis.
