# UNDERGRADUATE INDUSTRY PROJECTS

### INDUSTRY PROJECTS

Industry projects provide students undertaking an undergraduate degree in the Monash Business School with first-hand experience integrating theory with practice in a business context. A project focusses on the major discipline area of your degree.

Students find their own project (paid or unpaid) in Melbourne, interstate or overseas.

Students can obtain 6 or 12 credit points depending on the duration of the project, providing it meets academic requirements.

#### BENEFITS FOR STUDENTS

Students will experience life in the workforce with the opportunity to apply the theoretical knowledge they have gained at Monash University

A project can be a valuable opportunity to gain marketable skills for future employment.

#### BENEFITS FOR EMPLOYERS

Enhance their workforce by taking on students who:

- have up-to-date knowledge in the area in which the business operates.
- are eager to apply that knowledge for the betterment of the business.

#### PERIOD AND TIME OF THE PROJECT

The industry project is for a minimum of:

- 20 working days - 6 credit points (BEX3350)
- 30 working days - 12 credit points (BEX3450)

This can be full-time or on an equivalent part-time basis (subject to agreement between the business, Monash Business School and the student).

Students undertake industry projects:

- Part-time or full-time during semester
- During summer or winter semesters (only 6 credit points in winter)

#### HOW WILL STUDENTS BE GRADED?

Students' tasks are graded for assessment.

These tasks are marked by Monash Business School and will include:

- Supervisor evaluation
- Student self-evaluation
- Oral presentation
- Reflective essay
- Portfolio of placement activities

#### REMUNERATION DURING THE PROJECT

Participating businesses are not obligated to remunerate students undertaking these programs. Some businesses may offer a nominal gratuity to students to cover expenses.

#### ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for an industry project, students should have completed 96 credit points and have a credit average.

Projects need to be approved by the Academic Coordinators before enrolment to ensure they meet the unit requirements.
