CANDIDATE RESPONSIBILITIES

- Drive meetings/communications with supervisor(s)
- Negotiate and agree on expectations with your supervisor(s)
- Document your progress
- Participate in Academic Unit activities and interact with other researchers
- Be aware of rules and regulations
- You are enrolled 365 days per year: not just during teaching semesters
- Re-enrol annually





ENROLMENT

ATTENDANCE

Enrolled ALL YEAR with 4 weeks' annual leave (pro rata)

- 4 days a week Full Time students
- 2 days a week Part Time students



SUPERVISOR MEETINGS

At least every two weeks with their supervisors

- A minimum of two 'in person' meetings with your supervisors each year
- Attend all courses, seminars, workshops and activities



SUPERVISION

- Meet approximately 1 hour per fortnight
- Regular feedback on progress
- Establish timelines
- Academic research
- Assist in preparing for milestones
- Guidance on:
 - Responsible research practice and ethics
 - Occupational health and safety
 - Intellectual property
 - Suitable PD activities
- Identify and approach examiners
- Administrative matters: approval of leave,
 Study Away applications etc.



STUDY AWAY

Maximum entitlement 12 months during course enrolment

Study away may be necessary to support fieldwork, conduct interviews, expert consolation or conference attendance.

The following **MUST** be considered first:

- Program requirements will be met prior to any relevant milestones;
- Adequate arrangements for supervision are in place;
- The facilities available are adequate for the conduct of the research to be undertaken; and
- Ethics clearance has been gained



FORMAL LEAVE

Maximum entitlement 12 months during course enrolment in addition to 20 days annual leave / annum

- Students applying for leave need to consider the impact of that leave in relation to any program requirements
- Leave of absence/intermissions in the first or last six months of candidature will not normally be approved



RE-ENROLMENT

Annual enrolment requirement

- Students who do not re-enrol on time will be liable for a late re-enrolment fee and may have their enrolment terminated.
- Re-enrolment for 2024 will commence approx. early
 October (timely re-enrolment closes late November)

SUBMISSION AND EXAMINATION

- Your exhibition dates will be provided to you approx. 6 months in advance.
- The MADA Graduate Research Office schedules exhibitions in the MADA Gallery.
 If you are unable to meet your allocated exhibition date, we cannot guarantee an alternative spot in the gallery.
- All students receive up to \$900 to support their examination exhibition. Funds are paid to candidates on a reimbursement basis.



PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

STRUCTURE OF PD

Students are required to complete a minimum of 120 hours of professional development activities:

- Excellence in Research & Teaching
 - which are designed to develop knowledge, skills and abilities that are immediately relevant to academic life.
- Professionalism, Innovation & Career
 - which are designed to develop the knowledge, skills and abilities needed to apply your expertise within and beyond academia.

PD provides graduate researchers with structured opportunities to develop a variety of knowledge, skills and abilities relevant to different stages of their research project and career.

PD ACTIVITIES

Activities are offered centrally, by MADA and other Faculties, the library and SAS. Students should develop their learning plan in consultation with their supervisor according to what is relevant for their research project and stage of their career development.


What to consider when developing and structuring your learning plan

- Mandatory modules: some are offered centrally, e.g. Research Integrity, some by MADA
- Level of activity: foundational, intermediate or advanced
- Pre-requisites: activities can be / have pre-requisites for others
- Frequency / duration of activities
- Other Faculties might offer activities that are relevant to your project
- MADA activities are developed by the Departments and Wominjeka Djeembana; some are open to all students, some are limited to the department cohorts
- Mode and duration of activities: can be online, in-person or hybrid
- Some activities might involve attendance of off-campus events



INDUSTRY ENGAGEMENT

What is an eligible industry engagement?

- Position with a research end-user that is covered by an agreement between Monash industry partner candidate within first 18 months of candidature
- Research is related to your PhD research
- For a minimum of 60 working days (FTE)

Please discuss with your supervisor during the first year of your candidature whether you would like to / are engaging with an industry partner. Undertaking an eligible industry engagement will earn you 60 hours of PD activities.



Key elements supporting your enrolment

- Variations to your enrolment/candidature
 - i.e. Leave; Study Away (travel); Extensions (thesis submission date)
 - Apply using online <u>forms</u>

IMPORTANT

- ✓ Include <u>all required information and any supporting</u> <u>documentation</u> – helps it workflow to assessment and approval much quicker
- Once you submit your form it workflows through to your supervisor, graduate coordinator/program director and (depending on the form) the Associate Dean of Graduate Research of your faculty.
- ✓ Allow 1-2 weeks for it to reach MGRO
- ✓ Where a case needs to be made to the Academic Director allow 1-2 weeks

MILESTONES


Milestones

- Are a requirement of your course, designed to support your progress and complete on time
- Opportunity to discuss your progress and experience; seek feedback and guidance on the direction of your research project from an independent academic review panel; discuss barriers and how to resolve them

Milestone due dates

- Are visible on your Research Enrolment Summary
- Milestone due dates are set at commencement for 12 months - Confirmation
 - 24 months Progress Review
 - 36 months Final Review (PhD only) EFT

You have the flexibility to schedule a milestone within 2 months EFT of its due date.



- You will receive automated reminder emails to keep you on track.
 - Reminder 1: 3 months before Milestone Due date
 - Reminder 2: 1 month before Milestone Due date
 - Action Required: 1 month after Milestone Due date

LEAVE

Annual Leave

- Enrolment allows for 4 weeks annual leave (pro rata) per year.
- Annual leave is arranged in consultation with your supervisor

Leave of Absence

You can also apply for leave of absence to take leave from your studies for a period of 10 days up to a maximum 12 months during your candidature.


- Leave of absence is used for:
 - leave for personal and professional commitments
 - o sick leave or carer's leave
 - defense reserve service leave
 - jury service
 - o firefighting and emergency assistance
 - o family violence leave.
- Leave of Absence will shift your thesis submission date by the duration of the leave approved.





Compulsory Module

Literature search process

For comprehensive literature searching it is important to be systematic in your approach. This includes developing a plan for your search (including the search terms you will use and the resources you will search), and keeping records of the searches you carry out. The process is listed in steps below, but much of it is iterative rather than linear.

Define your research question

- Inclusions
- Exclusions

Identify relevant search terms

- Scoping searches
- Terms in related reviews

Develop your search plan

- Combine terms with AND / OR, or as phrases
- Apply truncation / wildcards

Test and refine your search

- Check results for key articles
- Apply limits or filters

Select relevant databases and







Caulfield Art Exhibition Catalogues and Ephemera

This growing online collection includes printed material relating to artists and their works, with a special focus on the output of Australian creatives. Many of the items are unique and some have only previously been held in uncatalogued collections. Items have been gathered via donations from galleries, artists, alumni and from MADA (the Monash Faculty of Art, Design and Architecture).

The Caulfield Campus of Monash University has a long history of teaching of art theory and practice. Initially established as Caulfield Institute of Technology in 1968, the campus became Chisholm Institute of Technology in 1982 before merging with Monash University in 1990. Over the years, artists have used the campus as a space to learn and create, and the library's collection of art exhibition catalogues and related ephemera has developed to support both research and artistic inspiration.

Participate in making the relationship work - talk to your supervisor!

- Be honest
- Be reasonable
- · Be calm but assertive
- Be aware of your rights and responsibilities
- Don't make assumptions
- In the first instance, discuss any concerns directly with your supervisor, and as soon as possible







Discuss context as well as academic content:

- The frequency, duration and timing of meetings
- The amount of work and rate of progress expected of you
- The feedback you can expect to receive from your supervisor
- Compare your expectations of how the supervision arrangement will work and your supervisor's expectations
- Let your supervisor know if you have a personal problem that is affecting your progress







Good practice:

- Accept that some level of stress and anxiety is normal
- Set realistic expectations of yourself
- Develop a balanced, daily routine that works for you
- Take a break and enjoy it don't spend the time feeling guilty
- Remember to keep the PhD in perspective
- Stop trying to explain your research to your friends and relatives







Cultural differences can affect your student/ supervisor relationship:

- Feeling it is inappropriate to question or disagree with your supervisor
- Not contributing to discussions can be misinterpreted
- The Australian academic culture is one which encourages academic debate







- Our advocates are professional staff who deal with more than 1000 cases each year
- Independent from the University our obligation is to graduate students only
- Free and confidential service
- Consultations can be conducted by email, phone, Zoom or in-person.
- Remember, you're not alone! It doesn't matter how small or big your issue is - we focus on helping you get the best outcome
