Gain specialist knowledge and skills to support your professional practice and help transform addiction policy, programs and services.

The Master of Addictive Behaviours is delivered in partnership with Turning Point, an internationally recognised addiction treatment, research and education centre.

You will learn from local and international experts about contemporary addiction issues to support the health and social wellbeing of people and communities affected by substance use, behavioural addictions and other emerging addictive behaviours.

Our course combines the quality and recognition of a Monash qualification, with the flexibility of online delivery.

In the Master of Addictive Behaviours you will:

- Learn about how substance use disorders or addictions can develop and persist.
- Explore how addiction impacts individuals, families, communities and social systems.
- Develop expertise and skills in applying professional and scholarly work to practice.
- Evaluate the evidence base of treatments, public health and policy and harm minimisation for substance use and behavioural disorders or addictions.
