COURSE STRUCTURE

CLINICAL UNITS

Extend your clinical knowledge and practice within the six core clinical units, including advanced airway concepts, trauma care and complex cardiac aetiologies.

RESEARCH UNITS

Broaden your capacity to conduct research related to either intensive care, community care or aeromedical retrieval.

ELECTIVE UNITS

Electives are available aimed at broadening your knowledge within the healthcare system. Topics include: Emergency Management, Education, Patient Safety and Quality Improvement, and Healthcare Leadership.

CORE CLINICAL UNITS

You will have the opportunity to develop holistically as a clinician, and learn from other allied and emergency health professionals in fields like patient safety, emergency management and clinical education.

RESEARCH UNITS

Monash is recognised globally for research excellence. As part of the Master of Critical Care Paramedicine, you have the opportunity to work on a research project with one of our expert supervisors.

Completing this research project can be used as a pathway to a graduate research degree, such as Doctor of Philosophy.
