Bachelor of Biomedical Science

14 compulsory units (84 credit points) + 2 level 3 biomedical units (12 credit points) = **Total of 96 points**

Bachelor of Laws (Honours) 17 common core units (102 credit points) + 9 elective units (54 credit points) including **one** commercial law elective and **one** research project unit = **Total of 156 points.**

Double degree – total credit points = 96 + 156 = 252 credit points
