ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

All places in the Bachelor of Allied Health are Commonwealth Supported Places (CSP). Rural applicants are encouraged to apply for the [Dean's Rural List](#) for special consideration pathways.

STUDY YOUR WAY

The course will be taught across two extended semesters within a calendar year, with breaks in teaching aligned to Victorian public school holidays.

The course will be offered at each of our three rural health sites in Bairnsdale, Mildura or Wonthaggi, and students will be supported by the long-standing health networks in the region.

Students have the flexibility to study close to home without needing to relocate or commute to a metropolitan campus. This supports local students to train, live and work in their own communities.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Upon graduation, graduates are eligible to apply for registration with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Authority (AHPRA) and be qualified to practise as an Occupational Therapist, Physiotherapist or Podiatrist. Qualifying accreditation has been sought from the relevant professional councils.

There will be opportunities to work across a diverse range of settings including; hospitals, rehabilitation centres, private practice, community health centres, schools, social services, aged care, government agencies and disability services.

Monash graduates are well recognised by industry and are in demand.

FURTHER STUDY

Successful completion of this course may provide a pathway to other postgraduate studies, provided you meet the entry requirements for that particular course.
