Frequently Asked Questions

If I complete this program, what skills will I obtain?

The MUDRP is designed to support health professionals (including registered pharmacists) to acquire the required knowledge and skills to develop a research protocol.

Can I credit this microcredential to an award course?

The MUDRP is also approved as a microcredential with Monash University. Microcredentials are short courses with assessment, that can lead to credit in an award program.

Learners who have completed the MUDRP micro-credential may be eligible to apply for 6-credit points of credit towards an award course (subject to credit limits). Completion of the MUDRP micro-credential is not a guarantee of admission into an award course. To enrol into a Monash Pharmacy Postgraduate award course, you must apply for and meet all published eligibility criteria. Please note that award courses have maximum credit limits and recency requirements for credit. You should check with the Program Coordinator to ensure you meet these requirements. Who is eligible to enrol in this program?

This program is eligible for healthcare professionals that are registered with Ahpra (except provisionally registered pharmacists i.e. pharmacy interns). Applicants will be required to submit evidence of their registration (e.g. certificate of registration).

Exceptions will be considered for individuals that are not currently registered healthcare professionals with Ahpra (e.g. pharmacy technicians) but who would benefit from completion of this program. In this case, individuals are encouraged to contact the Director of EDGE (steven.walker@monash.edu) directly.

The program is designed to support learners to develop a research protocol for a project relevant for their workplace. The online learning material and workshops focus on research methodologies most suited to a practice-based research project conducted in a healthcare setting. Therefore, all applicants are required to complete a brief 500-word summary explaining why they have chosen to complete the program and describing an initial project idea that they will work on during the program. This will help the team determine the suitability of the program in relation to the learners needs.

How much does the program cost?

The MUDRP costs \$1,600 AUD to complete.

A discounted rate of \$1,440 AUD may be available to cohorts from a single workplace, if their learning is supported by more senior leaders at their workplace. Please contact the Academic Lead (louise.lord@monash.edu) or Director of EDGE (steven.walker@monash.edu) for more information

We also offer a version of this program that does not include assessments. In this case, you will complete the online learning material and workshops only. This version of the program is not a microcredential and the cost for this version is \$1,300 AUD.

How long does the program take?

The MUDRP comprises of 100 hours of learning and assessment. This includes all the online content, attendance at the required workshops and set assessments described in the Key Dates section.

Online Modules	Self-paced, interactive online learning	24 hours
Workshops	Face to face and moderated to provide in-depth guidance to progress your research protocol	6 hours
Assessments	Written and oral formats, including the preparation and delivery of the finalised research protocol	70 hours

Am I considered a Monash University student by completing this program?

Learners in the MUDRP are not enrolled students at Monash University and do not have student access to facilities and services, including Monash ID, Monash IT account, Library or learning resources that are licensed for enrolled students only. Along with the program content, the moderators will provide appropriate support and resources for learners to successfully complete the MUDRP.

What is the refund policy?

If a learner does not abide by the conditions of the MUDRP, the team reserves the right to cancel the participant's registration at any time and without a full refund of fees.

Learners can apply in writing to withdraw from a course and obtain a refund:

- A full refund (100%) will be provided if you apply to withdraw at least 28 calendar days prior to the MUDRP commencement date.
- A 50% refund will be provided if you apply to withdraw at least 14 calendar days prior to the MUDRP commencement date.
- No refund will be provided if you apply to withdraw later than 14 calendar days prior to the MUDRP commencement date.
- Note: in the event of late withdrawal, you may credit your registration fee to another date (same course) within two years of your original registration.
