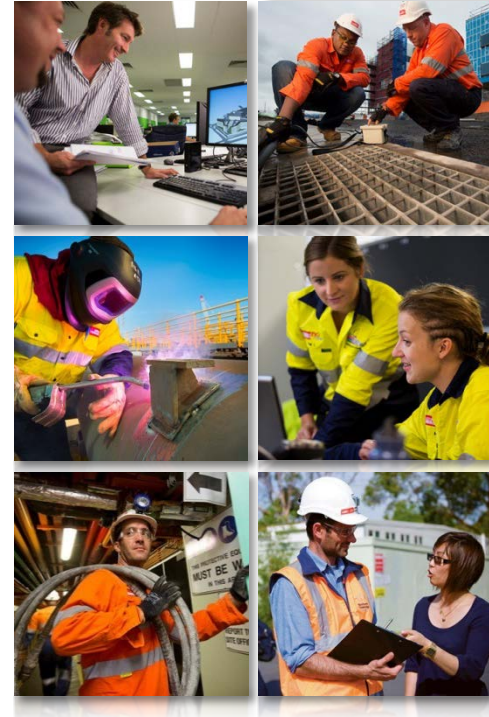
There is more than ever to be done

- There is no let up any time soon



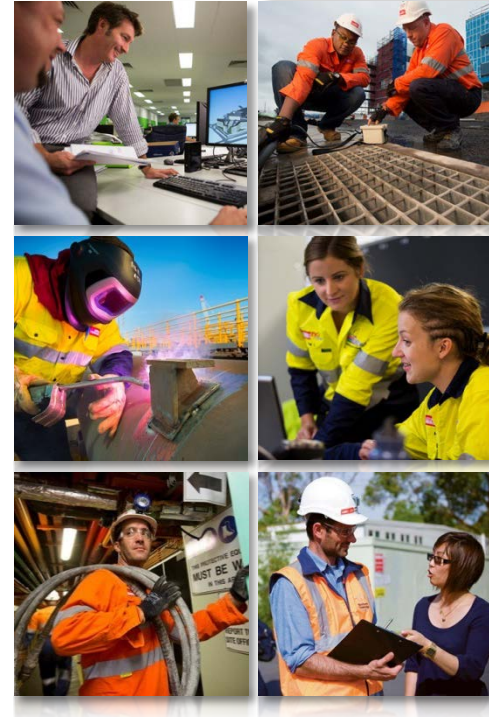
The tide of change continues
