Course structure

The course is structured in three parts. Part A. Advanced preparatory, Part B. Mastery knowledge and Part C. Application studies. All students complete Part B. Depending upon prior qualifications, you may receive credit for Part A or Part C or both.

Part C. Application studies (24 credit points)

You must complete four units (24 points) at either level 4 or 5. Elective units may be chosen from the Faculty of Business and Economics or across the University as long as you have the prerequisite and there are no restrictions on enrolling in the units.

- Managing diversity and inclusion
- Geo-politics and business globalisation - Cross-cultural management communication

Entry requirements

Applicants must have completed an Australian bachelor degree (or equivalent) with a Weighted Average Mark (WAM) of 60 or an equivalent GPA as determined by the School. Applicants must also have completed a minimum of 6 months relevant work experience.

Depending upon your prior qualifications and experience you may be eligible for entry credit, which reduces the duration.
