

L3005 Bachelor of Laws (Honours) and Bachelor of Commerce (LLB(Hons)/BCom) 2015 Course Map

Bachelor of Laws (Honours) 17 common core units (102 credit points) + 9 elective units (54 credit points) including **one** commercial law elective and **one** research project unit = **Total of 156 points.**

Bachelor of Commerce 5 core units (30 points) + 8 units of major* (48 points) + 3 electives (18 points) = Total of **96 points**
Double degree – total credit points = 96 + 156 = 252 credit points
