

Global Intercampus Program for Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences students

If you are enrolled in a Bachelor of Pharmacy or Bachelor of Pharmaceutical Sciences degree, then there are some additional considerations when applying for the Global Intercampus Program to Monash University Malaysia.

When can I participate in the program?

Depending on your degree, the semesters in which you can participate in GIP are different. You can refer to the table below, which includes the set lists of units which you would be completing during the given semester in Malaysia.

Are there any other considerations?

- Please note that PHR2012 Professional Practice 4 (12 credit points) involves a placement in a Malaysian community pharmacy. While this placement does not necessarily require ability in Malay language, some introduction to the language will be beneficial.
- For BPharmSci (P2001/P3002) – it is possible to study only 18 credit points during your semester, if you wish. You should note, however, that if you study fewer than 24 credit points a semester, it will extend the duration of your degree. This is not an option for students enrolled in BPharm (P3001/P6001), who must enrol in 24 credits every semester.

How many places are available?

There are five places for BPharm (P3001/P6001) and five places for BPharmSci (P2001/P3002).

How are students selected?

When you submit your Application for Overseas Study and your Study Plan, your faculty will assess your eligibility. At the end of the application period, if there are more applicants than places available, the Faculty of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences will make their selection primarily based on academic merit.

What funding is available?

All participants in the GIP to Malaysia are automatically assessed for the Monash Abroad Band A Travel Grant (\$2500). If you are eligible, you will receive an offer after you have completed all of the pre-departure requirements.
