

6- Research Participation by Students in A Studio

When students participate in studios and you're teaching them, you might want to use their work for your thesis. If you want to use student work, you should inform them. Although it's now covered under the MASH privacy policy for students, out of respect and courtesy, you should still tell them, especially if they are your current students.

There's no reason why you cannot inform them at the start. However, there are issues to consider, such as whether students will worry about their marks if they say no to using their work. They might be concerned about failing that unit or similar repercussions. You will need to manage this and explain it in the ethics application. If the students have already graduated, using the data is allowed under the privacy policy.

Participation by students in studios: You're teaching students and want to use their work that you're developing for your thesis. We touched on this before. If you want to use student work, tell them. It's covered now in the Monash privacy policy for students. Out of respect and courtesy for current students, inform them at the start. Of course, consider if this will affect their marks. Manage this and explain in the ethics application. If the students have already graduated, using their data is allowed under the privacy policy.

Scenario seven: If you're working with the same project across multiple groups, do you use one ethics application or separate ones for each group? Put it all into one application and ensure it's structured to accommodate the different groups. For very small projects, we can discuss how to handle them.
