We invite abstract submissions from Early - and Mid- Career Researchers and Health professionals. Abstracts will be accepted for a 10 - minute oral presentation or poster. Prizes will be provided for the best oral presentation and best poster presentation.

Poster Presentation	Permanently displayed during the conference	Posters will be displayed within the conference and catering area.

### PREPARATION GUIDELINES

In order for your presentation to be considered, these abstract guidelines must be followed. Please ensure that the presenting author completes the abstract submission.

1. Please indicate at the top of your document:

-Preferred theme

-Preferred presentation type

- Short biography of presenter (maximum 50 words). This information will be used by the session chair for introduction purposes

Note: Abstract presenters will be required to fund their own attendance at the conference and should not submit an abstract if this is not possible

2. Length: The maximum of the main body of the abstract should be 250 words (i.e. excluding title, authors and institutions).

3. Title: The abstract title should reflect the main content and nature of the abstract; do not use abbreviations within the title.

4. Authors' names and affiliations (indicate presenting author and contact details - address, telephone and email).

5. Structure: Abstracts must be structured using the following format: Introduction, Aims, Methods, Results, and Discussion
