

Dr Angelica Lindén Hirschberg, Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the Department of Women's and Children's Health at the Karolinska Institute is also head of the Women's Health Research Unit and a Consultant Gynecologist in charge of Gynecological Endocrinology at the Karolinska University Hospital. Angelica has a special focus on Reproductive Medicine

Angelica's research is focused on disorders of reproductive dysfunction and gonadal development in women. The overall aim is to improve diagnostics, fertility and long-term health in women with strenuous exercise, obesity, polycystic ovary syndrome (PCOS), primary ovarian insufficiency (POI) and disorders of sex development (DSD). The research is translational from experimental *in vitro* studies of endometrial function to randomised controlled trials and population-based epidemiological studies performed in collaboration with national and international research networks.

Professor Hirschberg is a fellow of the Endocrine Society, board member of The International Society of Gynecological Endocrinology, the official gynecologist of the Swedish Olympic Teams and a medical expert for the Swedish Anti-Doping Committee, the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF) and the International Olympic Committee (IOC). In 2009 Professor Hirschberg was appointed a Physician-in-Attendance to the Swedish Royal Family
