Abstract:

The burden on ill-health is often measured in terms of impact on years of life and quality-adjusted life years (QALYs). Prof Danny Liew and his group advocate for also estimating burden on productivity, using the novel measure of 'productivity-adjusted life year' (PALY). In this presentation, Danny will discuss the concept of the PALY, and illustrate its (published) use in the areas of diabetes and smoking.

Professor Danny Liew is the Chair of Clinical Outcomes Research, Head of the Division of Clinical Epidemiology and Co-Director of the Centre for Cardiovascular Research and Education at Monash University's School of Public Health and Preventive Medicine. He is also a consultant physician at the Alfred Hospital in General Medicine and Clinical Pharmacology. Danny's research capacity and interests lie in epidemiology, clinical trials, health services research and health technology assessment.
