- Gain specialist knowledge through a choice of electives in areas like child protection, addiction and criminology.
- Develop your research skills and discover how research informs social work practice.

WHAT DO SOCIAL WORKERS DO?

Social workers advocate for some of the most vulnerable people within society and make our communities more inclusive. It's a challenging yet rewarding career, where you empower people to make change in their lives or overcome systematic disadvantages. This could be by providing counselling or coordinating care, or driving large-scale social impact for whole communities, through policy and research.

PLACEMENTS

You'll complete two 500-hour supervised placements, working with individuals, groups and communities with one of our partner organisations. This may include a placement in a rural or regional location. Your placement could take you to one of Victoria's major health services such as Monash Health or Peninsula Health, the Department of Justice and Victorian Child Protection Services and non-profit organisations like Big Brothers Big Sisters, Safe Steps and Family Violence Response Centre.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Our course is accredited by the Australian Association of Social Workers, so you'll graduate as a qualified social worker. Social work has strong projected employment growth and social workers are among the most needed roles in Australia*. As a social worker, you can work in a diverse range of settings including:

- mental health
- community and human service organisations
- child protection and youth support services
- family violence centres
- government departments
- hospitals and health care.

RESEARCH

Monash is recognised globally for research excellence. As part of the Master of Social Work, you may have the opportunity to work on a social work research project, with one of our expert supervisors. Completing this research project can be used as a pathway to a graduate research degree, such as Doctor of Philosophy.
