No matter what course you commence with us – every Monash Pharmacy student completes the same 4 years of the Bpharm(Hons)

First Time Enrolment

- Your handbook entry (see [5 year](#) or [4 year](#)) and [course webpage](#) detail the units and other requirements you must meet to complete your degree
- For course maps please check the [course webpage](#) (under 'course planning'). Course maps indicate the unit codes you will enrol in etc
- You'll need to enrol for both semester 1 and 2
 - Full-time study (local and international students) = 5 units total for the first year (two in semester 2 with one of these worth 18 credit points)
- Note: Credit for previous studies is currently not offered to Pharmacy applicants**
- Note: Graduate Entry students are enrolled by the Faculty after accepting their offer – this process cannot be completed online**

Other considerations

- At this stage you will need to ensure that you have created a computer account and completed the rest of the enrolment processes, including fees and the enrolment questionnaire, via the web enrolment system (WES). Instructions are provided on our [Get Started website](#).
- [Monash Connect](#), Parkville is available should you have any questions about the technical or fees side of the enrolment process via WES. Please note that you must complete all of the enrolment steps, including the fees forms, or your fees may be calculated incorrectly.
- There are critical placement requirements that you must comply with before arriving on campus - [satisfy the immunisation requirements specified by the Faculty](#); [hold a valid Working with Children Card](#); and [complete \(with satisfactory result\) a National Police Records Check](#). Detailed information on how to comply with these checks is also outlined on the [Faculty website](#). Any questions about these placement requirements should be directed to Pharmacy.StEPs@monash.edu.
- The Pharmacy course team would like to highlight:
 - the course's [personal requirement standards](#) for all Pharmacy students prior to their enrolment
 - there is a **pass by year rule** attached to the course for course planning purposes – and a **pass by semester rule** from year 2
