A2006 BACHELOR OF ARTS (SOCIAL SCIENCES)

The placement of units may be rearranged to provide flexibility in choice of elective units and to support sequencing for double degree courses but care should be taken to ensure sequenced units are maintained in sequence.

In choosing your units you must ensure that you complete a maximum of 60 credit points at level 1 and a minimum of 36 credit points at level 3, of which at least 24 credit points must be Arts units.
