SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES

PROFESSOR MATTHEW GILLESPIE

Vice-Provost (Faculty and Graduate Affairs),
Office of the Provost and Senior Vice-President

Prior to Professor Gillespie's arrival at Monash University in 2014 he was Director of Prince Henry's Institute 2008-2013, and was an Associate Director of Melbourne's St Vincent's Institute of Medical Research.

An active member of the Australian and global scientific communities, Professor Gillespie has held editorial roles including on the boards of Arthritis and Rheumatism, Bone, Endocrinology, and the Journal of Bone and Mineral Research. He has also served on a number of research committees including Cancer Council Victoria, NHMRC Research Committee (2006-2012) and NHMRC Audit Committee (2006-2019). He was president of the Australian Society for Medical Research (1999-2000) facilitating additional funding for the NHMRC, and also served for the Australian and New Zealand Bone and Mineral Society being President during 2011-2013.

During his term on NHMRC Research Committee he held the portfolio of Project Grants and has served as a Panel Chair on GRPs since 2006 as well as on ad hoc international special initiatives of NHMRC.

PROFESSOR MICHAELA RANKIN

Deputy Dean, International,
Monash Business School

Michaela Rankin joined Monash University in 2007, and has held a range of leadership roles in the Department of Accounting, including Director of Education and Deputy Head of Department. In addition to service to academia, Michaela has maintained a strong presence in professional and industry circles.

Michaela is a highly regarded educator, and her passion and commitment to the student learning experience has been formally recognised in awards from the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia and Monash University.

Her research focuses on corporate governance, financial reporting, executive compensation and sustainability, and integrated reporting, with her work being published widely across top journals.

DR CAMPBELL WILSON

Campbell Wilson joined Monash University in 2005, and has held a range of teaching and leaderships roles in the Faculty of Information Technology. Campbell is the Associate Dean, International of the Faculty and leads their international strategy. He is also Co-Director of the Monash University/Australia Federal Police AiLECS Lab and a Senior Lecturer in information retrieval, text mining, data mining and machine learning.

Campbell's research areas are in information retrieval, digital forensics, data mining, text mining and machine learning.

Michelle Lopez is Director, Graduate Research Office at Monash University. Dr Howard (Howie) Manns works in the Linguistics Program, where he is the coordinator of the Master of Applied Linguistics. His primary research interest is language variation and change and the impact of this change on speakers and communities. Howie's current work focuses on the Australian Deaf-Blind community, Australian English, Indonesian youth, and the development of intercultural competence. He has previously worked on language variation in Farsi and Spanish. He has also worked on projects to document the Javanese dialect spoken south of Malang, the development of sentiment analysis systems, and studied attitudes in the Australian-Indonesian relationship.

DR ENDAH REJEKI

Deputy Director for Advocacy and CFC
Development, Ministry of Women's Empowerment
and Child Protection

Endah Sri Rejeki is based in Jakarta. She works for the Ministry of Women's Empowerment and Child Protection as the Deputy Director for Advocacy and CFC Development. The organisation assists in creating and implementing policies and supports state policy regarding women and children. It aims to promote gender mainstreaming and increasing the role of the community in women's empowerment and child protection.

She heads a program called Child Friendly Cities, Kota Layak Anak (KLA) designed to promote cities to be better equipped to offer children a better way of life and quality education.

Rejeki is a Monash University alumna, having completed a PHD in Human Geography in 2018 that focused on Child Friendly Cities and a Master in International Development and Environmental Analysis (2008).

DR MISITA ANWAR

(2014, PhD IT), Senior Lecturer
Universitas Negeri Makassar, Indonesia

Dr Misita Anwar received an AUSAID Scholarship for her Masters Degree in Information Science at UNSW and a John Crawford Scholarship for her Bachelor Degree in Communication Engineering at La Trobe University, completed with Honours. Her PhD (completed in 2014) was undertaken at Monash University. In her research she explored the impact of mobile phones on the well-being of micro-entrepreneurs in Indonesia with her fieldwork undertaken in Makassar and Bandung. Her PhD was supported by a Scholarship from the Indonesian Ministry of Communication and Information. Currently a Senior Lecturer, Ms. Anwar has 16 years of experience as an academic at Universitas Negeri Makassar, Indonesia. Her main field of interest is twofold. On one hand - due to a personal philosophy of life and her PhD research project - the aspects related with Information and Communication Technologies for Development (ICT4D): mobile phones and wireless technology for development and capability expansion, micro-entrepreneurs and social capital. On the other hand - and due to a professional engagement in the field and her background - the aspects related with wireless technology and empowerment: digital capacity building and literacy, SMS based systems, e-learning, information management and database management system. Dr. Anwar has published in several reputable journals and conference proceedings.

DR EDI RIYANTO

(2017, PhD Arts)
Lecturer, Universitas Airlangga

Edi Dwi Riyanto, Faculty of Humanities, Airlangga University undertook a Monash PhD at the Faculty of Arts in Anthropology. The research was on the survival and contribution of Javanese traditions in this contemporary context with the title 'Celebrity and Komunitas: The Rise and Fall of the Jogja Hip Hop Foundation (JHF)'. This thesis deals with the birth, rise, and decline of a hip hop group from Yogyakarta; its characteristics, its contexts, and its dynamics. JHF's product was Java Hip Hop so that an analysis on this provides a bird eye view on the potential, limitations, as well as tensions of expressing Javanese-ness in this contemporary setting.

Edi is also a co-founder of the Social Researchers Forum (SRF), established in 2014. SRF is a forum for PhD students and graduates, which began with Monash students, but has steadily begun to include students from other universities.

HADI HARIYANTO

(PhD submitted 2019, IT) Project Manager, Media and Digital Department, TELKOM Indonesia

Hadi Hariyanto manages an evaluation team in the area of digital tribe management, smart city innovations and eHealth solutions at TELKOM Indonesia.

In 2015 he received a scholarship from TELKOM Indonesia to pursue a PhD course in the Centre for Organizational & Social Informatics (COSI), Faculty of Information Technology, Monash University. His PhD research is about the evaluation of health information system implementation in public health care institutions in Indonesia. Hadi's research interests are eHealth design and evaluation using socio-technical approaches, innovation management, wireless communication and ICT for Development (ICT4D).

From 2010 – 2015, he was involved in several ICT-based collaborative research projects funded by the European Commission and Asia-Pacific Tele-community (APT Japan). One of the projects was the digitalization of maternal-postnatal care information systems using multimodal communication systems in Bandung Barat District.
