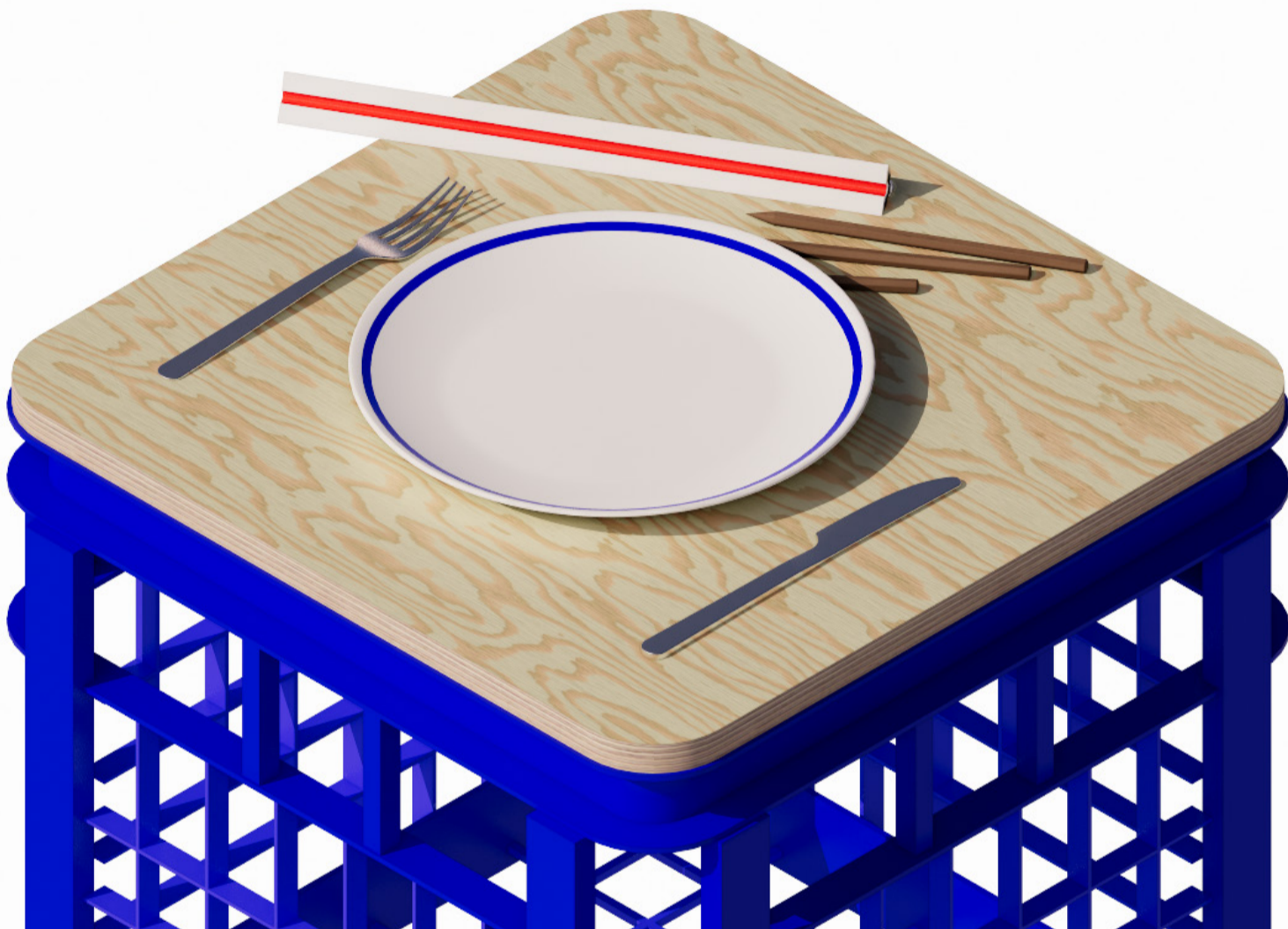


BREAKING BREAD



Breaking Bread will explore the rituals of sharing a meal and the role of the kitchen as a domestic and all-inclusive laboratory. The studio sets out to design and build a 1:1 scale temporary structure on campus to facilitate a cross-faculty social interaction.

We will be **prototyping** as a design methodology. This involves testing and working with materials to understand their physical limitations. Opposite to traditional practice, in this studio architectural documentation occurs once the final outcome is built and not as a set of instructions to build.

Breaking Bread will look beyond what we traditionally associate with architecture by welcoming other disciplines including digital design, electronics, cooking, and exhibition/event design amongst others.

This studio is:
