Centring cognitive disability expertise in organisational research and practice

This presentation introduces Jacinta's PhD research on organisational engagement with people with cognitive disability and presents early findings on current practices and factors that influence meaningful, inclusive participation.

Jacinta Oakley is a PhD candidate whose research focusses on participatory engagement with people with cognitive disability in organisational settings. Drawing on experience in accessibility and inclusive practice, her work examines how organisations involve lived experience experts and uses qualitative, co-designed methods to build practical supports for meaningful participation.

Developing a Continuity of Care Model to Support People with Chronic Disease in Indonesia

With a background in nursing, her research focuses on developing a continuity of care model for people with chronic disease in Indonesia. The effectiveness of environmental falls prevention interventions in bathrooms: an overview of reviews

In this presentation, Hayley will discuss her current work on the overview of reviews; the reasons for choosing an umbrella review, the processes used, and present some early findings.

Her clinical work inspired her PhD topic, which aims to investigate the impact of environmental factors on inpatient falls in hospital bathrooms. She works clinically on the acute wards, in both public and private health care settings.
