With our Bachelor of Physiotherapy (Honours), you'll think like a Physiotherapist from day one. Our integrated curriculum means you study only physiotherapy subjects. Each week, you'll explore a new health condition and body region through case-based learning and hands-on clinical skills.

As you progress, you'll apply your knowledge in real-world settings, including hospitals, rehabilitation centres, private practices, and sports medicine clinics.

In the Bachelor of Physiotherapy (Honours) you will:

- gain hands-on physiotherapy experience at leading hospitals and health services.
- practice your skills in small groups in our labs and on-campus facilities.
- learn from highly-skilled physiotherapists, so you'll stay up-to-date with best practice and innovation in the industry.
- study alongside other health students, preparing you to work collaboratively in interprofessional environments.

COURSE STRUCTURE

YEARS 1 & 2

You'll build a foundation in the biomedical and behavioural sciences, including anatomy, biomechanics, kinesiology, pathology, pharmacology, physiology, psychology, radiology and sociology.

Explore musculoskeletal, neurological and cardiorespiratory health conditions and the relevant physiotherapy treatments.

YEARS 3 & 4

Explore physiotherapy management of more complex conditions such as women's health, amputee care, cancer care, spinal pain, and mental health.

Gain insights into business and management in physiotherapy.

WHAT DO PHYSIOTHERAPISTS DO?

Physiotherapists restore and promote good health, helping people get the most out of life. They are experts in movement, function and physical health.

Physiotherapists play a key role in a person's recovery and often work as part of a team alongside other health professionals.

They conduct assessments and create treatment plans using movement analysis, manual therapy, education, and exercise to aid recovery, prevent injury, reduce pain, and improve mobility.

Physiotherapists can specialise in an area of practice, including cardiorespiratory, women's health, musculoskeletal, neurology, paediatrics and sports physiotherapy.

CLINICAL PLACEMENTS

Your clinical education will take place in a range of settings - from hospitals to rehabilitation centres to private practice, and may include both metropolitan and rural locations.
