### STUDENTS AND EARLY CAREER RESEARCHERS

Each year, we have over 30 PhD and postgraduate honours students. We also have a growing community of Early Career Researchers. The Dept of GP provides a supportive environment, with quality supervision and mentorship, regular team meetings, excellent study facilities and parking on site.



### SUMMER AND WINTER SCHOLARSHIPS

You can develop your research skills with a summer or winter scholarship. This scheme is for undergrad and postgrad students to undertake a small project over semester breaks.

As a scholar, you will:

- Work with a supportive research team on a project that falls within our areas of research excellence
- Experience community based research in general practice / primary care
- Gain insight into careers in research or academia.



### BMedSc AND HONOURS IN BACHELOR OF BIOMEDICAL SCIENCE

An honours year is an opportunity to complete a supervised research project to identify and address a gap in medical research knowledge.

The program provides you with:

- A strong foundation in the principles and practice of research
- A wide variety of skills including data analysis and communicating scientific ideas in oral presentations and a written thesis.

You can choose from a wide range of existing projects or develop your own with your chosen supervisor.



### ACADEMIC REGISTRARS

A GP Academic Registrar Post allows registrars to develop research skills as part of an individualized learning plan. The Post generally occurs over a 12-month period on a part time basis, and involves:

- Research in an academic general practice / primary care environment
- Supervision and training by senior researchers
- Participation in student teaching
- Mentorship by senior medical educators



### DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY (PhD)

Our academics support a large and diverse postgrad program in general practice/ primary care research.

Students benefit from strong supervision and peer support mechanisms.

A PhD can be flexible and taken over 3-4 years full time or part-time equivalent.

Our graduates gain the skills and professional attributes to make an immediate and enduring impact on academia, industry, government and community.



### POST-DOC POSITIONS

Post-doctoral positions in the Dept of GP include Early Career Research Fellows and Practitioner Fellows.

Post-docs develop and show leadership in projects that fall within our areas of research excellence. Established mentoring pathways support your career development in primary care / general practice research.



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
