## M5013 Graduate Diploma in Psychology

Students are advised to:

- First undertake the foundational units (PSY4111 and PSY4122) in any order.

- Next, undertake **intermediate units** (PSY4131 and PSY4051) in any order.

- Finally, complete the remaining core units (PSY4151, PSY4041, PSY4081, PSY4032, PSY4062) and one of the four **electives** (PSY4140, PSY4180, PSY5011 or PSY5013).
- Note PSY4151 is an intermediate unit, but not a pre-requisite for any further units. The **advanced units** are PSY4041, PSY4081, PSY4032 and PSY4062.
- Note that to enrol in the electives PSY5011 or PSY5013 you need to have completed 12 credit points (2 units).
