FOUNDATIONS FOR CONTEMPORARY NURSING PRACTICE

PROFESSIONAL PRACTICAL PLACEMENT

As part of your studies, you'll complete 800 hours of clinical placement in a range of healthcare settings.

PLACEMENTS

We partner with some of the state's major healthcare providers to give you access to high-quality clinical training.

As part of the Master of Nursing Practice, a large portion of your degree will be spent on placement at some of Victoria's major health services including Monash Health, Alfred Health, Eastern Health and Cabrini Health.

During your placements, you'll experience life as a nurse in a range of settings such as acute medical and surgical wards, mental health and community.

PROFESSIONAL RECOGNITION

After successfully completing your degree, you'll be eligible to apply for registration as a registered nurse with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA), provided you also meet their required English language skills standard.
